Joint Emergency Services Interoperable Principles (JESIP)

What is JESIP?

The UK's emergency services are admired and respected all around the world for the excellent service they provide. The emergency services all work to keep the UK safe and secure while protecting the public.

To ensure emergency responders are all communicating effectively the JESIP program was developed and rolled out for all emergency responders to complete from the first to arrive at an incident right through to the Strategic Commanders.



How does JESIP Work?

The JESIP Principles ensure all emergency responding commanders meet and work together at an incident using the same common language. Commanders should meet and share situational awareness regularly during an incident and ensure they all understand each other's needs and challenges.

Who Completes JESIP Training?

All EEAST Commanders (including non-substantiated and those on secondment) are required to attend a formal JESIP training session once every three years, and on-line training should be completed annually. Anyone can download the Official JESIP App which not only provides lots of information but also contains aid memoirs and useful information such as allowing you to record your METHANE report on the app. The app can be downloaded on to iPhones, Androids and Windows phone from their respective store and is free of charge. The app can also be found on the Trust ePCR where it can be used fully, allowing staff to complete and email their METHANE report (if they wish) from the scene to either the relevant Commander or the Tactical Ops Centre (Operations@eastamb.nhs.uk)
